

Falcons blast Spartans; others not so fortunate

Nick Latra and Wes Cornwell combined on a one-hitter Monday at Farmington, beat host Livonia Spartans 8-1 to win its first Lakes Division baseball game.

Latra pitched the first five innings, allowing only a run-scoring single to Stevenson's Glenn Pinneo in the fourth inning.

He struck out seven and walked three before giving way to Cornwell for the final two innings. Cornwell struck out four and walked none.

The Falcons improved to 3-2 overall and 1-2 in the division.

Leading 2-0 in the third, the Falcons extended their lead to 4-0 after a two-run homer by Dan McLaughlin.

Dale Domas was 2-for-3 with one run and one RBI. Latra, Jake Siskowsky and John Huhn had one hit each.

Farrer (3-0) walked four batters in the first inning, resulting in two runs before shutting out the Raiders the rest of the way. The southpaw scattered six hits, struck out seven and walked six.

"Jerry was overpowering," Glen coach Norm Hoopes said. "After struggling in the first inning, he settled down and cruised the rest of the way."

Cranbrook Kingswood girls golf coach Ed Van Dam led his team to the Oakland County tournament, gave his squad the following advice: the tournament was not going to be cancelled so they better be prepared to play in some rough conditions.

They listened well.

Cranbrook Kingswood braved the cold, windy weather, not to mention a rather wet Pontiac Country Club course, to capture the 15th annual county tournament Tuesday afternoon. No one else was close.

"The Aardvarks were the only team to break 400, finishing with a 389 four-player total. Second-place Bloomfield Hills Lahser — the defending county champion — placed 32 strokes back at 421."

Rochester captured third with a 432, followed by Farmington Hills Our Lady of Mercy (433) and Troy (447).

"We were hoping to be a factor in the tournament and we knew this tournament was going to be played," said Van Dam, whose team won its only other county title in 1983. "We're fortunate enough to have it here at Pontiac and we're not going to reschedule it very readily and the girls knew that."

Sophomore Ann Brown finished with a lifetime best round of 94 that was good for fifth overall.

Cranbrook Kingswood's other two low scores also finished among the medalists. Veteran seniors Kristie Boast and Elizabeth Cunningham finished with rounds of 103 and 104, respectively.

"We knew Shellie was a very good golfer. She's a very strong player and it was nice to see she could shoot what she was capable of," Van Dam said. "Under tough conditions like this it's a real credit to her as a ninth-grader."

"Ann (Brown) did for us today what Kristie and Elizabeth have been used to doing for us," he said. "We were second last year (at county) and we had four of our five players back, and our new player was Shellie Morton. So we knew, unless somebody else was going to be a lot better, we'd at least be in the running."

While Cranbrook Kingswood had a veteran team returning, it was just the opposite for Lahser. The Knights had a majority of their players graduate,
