

## POLICE/FIRE CALLS

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

## ■ DRUNKEN DRIVING

Farmington Hills police arrested a Westland man, 56, for drunken driving at 12:25 a.m. April 22 on eastbound Grand River at Middlebelt. The black 1989 Buick he was driving was going east in a westbound lane. The man had a blood-alcohol level of .21 percent. A level of .1 percent is considered too drunk to drive.

Farmington Hills police arrested a West Bloomfield man, 36, for drunken driving on westbound 14 Mile in Farmington Hills at 1:25 a.m. after stopping a black 1994 Jeep that crossed over the center line. The man had a blood alcohol level of .19 percent.

Farmington Hills police arrested a Southfield woman, 37, for drunken driving at 2:30 a.m. on eastbound Grand River at 10 Mile after the black 1985 Cadillac Deville cut off a police car. The woman would not cooperate with the arresting officer, refusing a

breath test and using vulgar language. After being taken to the police station, she accused the officer of arresting her because she resisted his advances. She struck the officer during processing.

Farmington Hills police arrested a Hills man, 42, for drunken driving April 19 after the man's black 1989 Ford Escort was involved in a personal injury accident at Eight Mile and Pearl. The man refused to take a blood alcohol test.

Farmington Hills police arrested a Walled Lake man, 32, for

drunken driving at 6:30 p.m. April 21 at M-5 and Drake in connection with a hit and run accident at Grand River and Middlebelt in Farmington Hills. The man drove a white 1991 S-10 pickup. He had a blood alcohol level of .38 percent.

Farmington Hills police arrested a Southfield man, 24, for drunken driving after his white 1991 GMC pickup jumped a curb and drove over a lawn on Ontaga in Farmington Hills April 21. He refused a blood alcohol test.

Farmington Hills police arrested a Brighton man, 41, for drunken driving in a green 1987 Ford Taurus after the car was in an accident on M-5 east of Drake at 8 p.m. April 21. The man had a blood alcohol level of .17 percent.

Farmington Hills police arrested a Hills man, 22, for drunken driving at Drake and Grand River April 22. Police stopped the 1994 Ford pickup truck for driving erratically. The driver had a blood alcohol level of .13 percent.

Farmington Hills police arrested a Chelsea man, 20, for drunken driving on Drake and Larkharbor April 22. Police stopped the 1987 Ford for traveling 50 mph in a 25-mph zone. The driver had a blood alcohol level of .12 percent.

## ■ SPOUSE ABUSE

A Redford woman, 28, told Hills police that a Farmington Hills man, 38, pushed her into closet doors at his Section 1 residence April 20. The woman said she is four months pregnant and that a similar incident occurred in March.

Farmington Hills police arrested a Hills woman, 40, for throwing and hitting a Hills man, 43, in the

head with an empty vodka bottle April 23 at their Section 11 home.

## ■ BREAK-INS

A \$50 face plate of a radio was stolen from a red 1989 Ford parked on Fox Club in Farmington Hills April 13-20 after the rear door window was broken causing \$200 in damage.

A \$300 cellular telephone was stolen from a white 1996 Chevy Lumina parked on Great Forest April 23 after the right front window had been smashed (\$200).

The rear driver's side window was smashed (\$150) on a blue 1994 Olds 88 Royale and a \$300 cellular phone was stolen April 23.

The rear driver's side window of a green 1993 Jeep Cherokee was smashed (\$350) and a \$200 briefcase, \$100 Franklin planner, \$100 Mont Blanc pen, \$100 Hewlett-Packard calculator and \$300 Ricoh 35 mm camera were stolen April 18 on Independence in Farmington Hills.

## ■ FIRES

Farmington Hills firefighters from Station 1 put out a kitchen fire at a house on Jonatown in Farmington Hills at 10 a.m. April 25. Firefighters from Station 4 rescued the homeowner who had gotten out through an upstairs window and walked until firefighters could rescue her. Damage is estimated at \$20,000 and the fire is under investigation.

Farmington Hills firefighters from Station 1 put out a small fire with heavy smoke in the top of a dryer at a house on Harbale in Farmington Hills at 2:27 p.m. April 24. The owner said she had been running the dryer all day.

Damage to the property was \$5,000 and damage to contents was \$2,000.

Farmington Hills firefighters from Station 1 responded to a reported stove fire at a house on Roosevelt in Farmington Hills at 3:26 p.m. April 20. The fire, caused by overheated grease, had been put out by the homeowner. Damage to the house was \$400 and damage to contents was \$500.

Farmington Hills firefighters from Stations 1 and 3 put out a small fire in a light fixture outside of the Citgo gas station on Grand River in Farmington Hills at 7:13 p.m. April 21. Damage was estimated at \$300.

An electrical problem in 1992 Mitsubishi parked at the Marathon station on 10 Mile at 8:13 p.m. April 22. The fire started under the dash and caused \$1,000 in damage to the car. The car's owner had put out the fire with a dry chemical extinguisher.

## ■ SEXUAL ASSAULT

Farmington Hills police arrested a Redford man, 31, for touching a Livonia woman, 33, on the buttocks and vaginal area April 23 at the Cadillac Cafe on Grand River in Farmington Hills. Police were checking the parking lot when the manager flagged them down and asked them to remove the man who was harassing women inside. Officers were directed to the victim, who was crying, and described the man as the offender.

## ■ VANDALISM

The right front window of a 1990 Lincoln Towncar parked at the Country Ridge Apartments on Great Forest in Farmington Hills was smashed causing \$200 in damage April 22-23.

## ■ ASSAULTS

A Hills man, 34, told Farmington Hills police that a patient at Botsford General Hospital on Grand River in Farmington Hills kicked at him after he told her she couldn't take home her newborn, cocaine-addicted baby. The man told the woman, a 28-year-old Detroit resident, that Protective Services had a policy regarding addicted babies.

A Westland man, 31, told Farmington Hills police that a Livonia woman, 29, hit him after they argued at the Kmart on Orchard Lake in Farmington Hills April 21.

A Bloomfield Hills man, 16, told Farmington Hills police that after he delivered some dry cleaning to a resident on Tulane, he was picked up and thrown against a car April 24.

## ■ THEFTS

A \$300 driver's side air bag was stolen from a purple 1993 Ford Probe at the Twelfth Estate Condos on 12 Mile in Farmington Hills April 22-23.

A \$120 Sears TV, a \$100 2-inch, hand-held TV, a \$50 clock radio, a \$20 hand-held radio and \$12 in cash were stolen from Botsford General Hospital on Grand River in Farmington Hills April 21-24.

## ■ RECEIVING AND CONCEALING

Livonia police arrested a Novi man, 42, for receiving and concealing, fleeing and eluding and drunken driving after he fed Farmington Hills and Livonia police on a chase through several neighborhoods, over lawns and eventually to a ditch, where the black 1994 Mazda (\$16,000) he had taken was stuck. Hills police had tried to pull the man over after noticing one of his tail lights was broken. After the arrest the man said he decided to flee a la "The Duke of Hazard."

## ■ FIRE DEPARTMENT RUNS

Farmington Hills firefighters made 87 runs for the week of April 17-23. Of those, 42 (48 percent) were medical emergencies, 14 were rescues and three were fires.

## ■ INDECENT EXPOSURE

Farmington Hills police arrested a Detroit man, 54, for indecent exposure after he was seen masturbating near his 1987 Volkswagens.

## ■ DRUGS

Farmington Hills police arrested three young men, 16, 16, and 17, all from Farmington Hills for possession of drugs at 4:30 p.m. April 24. The three were parked in a grey 1987 Ford Tempo parked at Marvellous Marvin's on Orchard Lake. Marijuana and suspected LSD were found along with drug paraphernalia.
