

POLICE/FIRE CALLS

listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

THEFTS

Cash totaling \$400 was stolen from a wallet at the Ram's Horn restaurant on Orchard Lake in Farmington Hills April 23.

Wire wheel covers (\$450) were stolen from a brown 1990 Cadillac parked at Vladimir's on Grand River in Farmington Hills April 22.

A yellow and blue coin paper box (\$750) belonging to the Detroit Newspaper Agency was stolen from in front of the Ram's Horn on Orchard Lake in Farmington Hills April 24-25.

A Farmington Hills woman, 21, said her husband, 25, with whom she has separated, came to her Section 24 home and argued with her, then pushed, grabbed and shook her.

DRUNKEN DRIVING

Farmington Hills police arrested a Hills man, 25, for drunken driving at 1:47 a.m. April 26 on eastbound 11 Mile after he was speeding in a red 1992 VW Passat west of 10 Mile. He had a blood alcohol level of .14 percent. A level of .1 percent is considered too drunk to drive in Michigan.

Farmington Hills police arrested a Royal Oak woman, 44, for drunken driving at 1:40 a.m. April

26 on westbound 12 Mile east of Drake. The woman was driving a blue 1989 Olds Delta 88 60 mph in a 30 mph zone. She had a blood alcohol level of .16 percent.

Farmington Hills police arrested a Hills man, 46, for drunken driving at 6:55 p.m. April 26 on southbound Northwestern Highway in Farmington Hills. The man had been parked in a lot and had been throwing up. An officer asked him if he needed help, but the man declined and drove away.
