

Lawson's fine pitching paces Harrison victory

Farmington Hills Harrison pitcher Jake Lawson stopped Plymouth Canton on one hit, enabling the Hawks to mercy beat Plymouth Canton 11-0 in five innings Friday.

"Jake had an overpowering fastball," Harrison coach John Herrington said. "He was around the plate and his curve ball was breaking. He was never in serious trouble; he was in complete command of his pitches."

While Lawson was choking off the Chiefs, giving up just a single to Eric Stidham leading off the fifth, the Hawks were ripping into Canton pitcher Jason Pennebacker for 14 hits and 11 runs.

Steve Beattie led the attack with three hits and three RBI.

Dave Hensel, Chris Puzzuoli and Mark Canton had two hits apiece, with Puzzuoli getting two RBI.

"We had been playing really, really well," Canton coach Scott Dickey said. "As I said before, if our pitchers throw strikes and keep the ball down and we play good defense, we'll be in it. Obviously, we didn't do any of those things today."

Canton committed five errors in the game; Harrison was errorless.

The win improved Harrison to 2-2 overall, and the loss dropped Canton to 7-4. Both are 2-1 in the Western Division.

■ NORTH 7, SIVENSON 0: Senior Mark Lee threw a two-hitter to hand visiting Livonia Stevenson the Lakes Division defeat.

Lee (1-0) struck out 12 without walking a batter to help North Farmington improve to 2-1 in the Lakes Division and 3-2 overall.

Lee's no-hitter was spoiled in the fifth inning when Jim Townsend singled. The only other hit was a single by Aaron Lee.

Eric Pierce paced North's offense, going 3-for-4 with a pair of doubles. Robert Roth and Lee both knocked in a run.

"Mark pitched a brilliant ball game and had a great change-up and curve," North coach Lee Horvath said. "We didn't hit the ball real well, but we got the runs."

Brad Goodell took the loss, testing the Stevenson Indians. Stevenson pitchers walked a total of 10 batters while allowing only six hits. The Raiders scored five unearned runs.

■ SALEM 5, FARMINGTON 0: Dan Quaine handballed the Falcons on three hits with his assortment of off-speed pitches to lead Plymouth Salem at Farmington.

His pitching prowess centered on keeping the Falcons off balance, and he did. In five innings, Quaine allowed three hits and seven walks, striking out three.

When he let the first two batters reach base in the sixth, Salem coach Dale Rumberger pulled him and inserted Brad Lee.

Lee struck out the first two batters he faced and got the third on a ground out. In two innings, Lee did not allow a base runner, fanning three.

Salem managed just five hits but

made the most of them, causing Nick Latra to take the loss. Wes Cornwell pitched the seventh for the Falcons, retiring all three batters he faced on strikes.

"It was a good baseball game. There weren't many mistakes by either side," Salem coach Dale Rumberger said, noting one error by each team.

Salem improved to 3-0 in the Lakes Division and 7-1 overall. Farmington is 2-2 in the Lakes.

■ CLARENCEVILLE 10-3, LUTHER NW 0-13: After merrily visiting Rochester Lutheran Northwest in the opener Friday, Clarenceville settled for the split in Metro Conference action. Both games were five-inning marbles.

In the opener, Robby Ashton hurled the three-hit shutout, striking out three

and walking two. Kyle McSorley went 3-for-4 with two RBI. Brian DeCaire had two hits, two RBI and three runs scored, and John Eastman added two hits and one RBI.

The Crusaders got their offense in gear in the nightcap, scoring 12 runs in the first three innings off DeCaire. Northwest scored 10 times in the third.

Hill Lyons had two of Clarenceville's six hits. McSorley added a run-scoring triple for the Trojans, 1-2 in the Metro and 2-5 overall.

On Thursday, Clarenceville scored in six of seven innings but lost to visiting Hamtramck 10-14.

The Trojans outbatted the Cosmos 13-9, but a three-run seventh for Hamtramck proved to be the difference.

George to stay at Wayne; Rose keeps job at HFCC

After meeting with Henry Ford Community College president Andrew Mazzara on Friday afternoon, Rodger George has decided to remain at Wayne State University as baseball coach.

George, who earlier in the month accepted the baseball coach's job at Henry Ford, faxed a statement Friday night to the Observer. The statement ends weeks of confusion surrounding the job at Henry Ford.

The decision means Stu Rose, a Farmington Hills resident and former Redford Union coach, will likely keep his job as Henry Ford coach.

"Dr. Mazzara and I had a long and wide-ranging discussion of the general well being of intercollegiate athletics," the statement said. "After this discussion I felt it was best for me and Wayne State if I finished the job I started at Wayne. Mr. Brennan (Wayne State athletic director Bob Brennan) has agreed to allow me to continue as head baseball coach."

"Mr. Brennan has been a great help and confident. The WSU baseball program is moving in the right direction, but much work remains. I hope to be able to lead the WSU baseball program to the place it should be."

George, a full-time faculty member at Henry Ford, was the

Hawks coach from 1981-88 before taking over at Wayne. He had seven straight winning seasons at Ford and is 97-202-5 in six-plus seasons at WSU.

Rose's renewable two-year part-time contract expires after this season and George could have unseated him because he is a union member. George applied for the position, and because of a clause in the union contract, Henry Ford had to offer him the job.

George reportedly accepted the job, but Henry Ford athletic director Nancy Bryden wouldn't officially name him the coach until George submitted a letter of acceptance and a copy of his resignation to Wayne State.

George never put his acceptance in writing.

In Friday's statement, George also addressed the issue regarding the union contract.

The contractual issue that was raised by Mr. Rose and Ms. Bryden still exists," the statement said. "In fact, when I introduced Mr. Rose to the HFCC community and rallied support for his hiring, this contractual issue was explained to him. There was no surprise."

Rose has led the Hawks to league championships in all six of his seasons as coach. The Hawks have won two of the last four regional titles and last year placed second at the National Junior College Athletic Association World Series.
