Hachem's character is on a turbucharped psychological roller-coaster as the plot twists and dives around her. The veteran actress handles the chaos well, considering the time compression in the script doesn't allow for "realistic" responses to events.

Unfortunately, Dereniak's fluidity and Hachem's emotion serve to amplify the woodeness of some of the younger, less esperienced performers. Bradd Stonye, 23, making his debut with the Guild, is effective in his portrayal of Clifford Anderson, but he never seems to be fully "in character."

The cast is completed by Wayne State University theater praduate Adam Carey, and University of Michigan junior Kristin Curle, Carvey plays Bruhl's attorney, Porter Milprim, in a change of casting from the original program. Curle, on the other hand, is as loose as the Gypsy garb she wears in her portrayal of the psychic neighbor Helpa Tendorn. What Curle lacks in technical skill on the stage she more than makes up for in real.

Lisa Brandow's manipulation of actors is very good. They are crossing the stage, switching positions in relation to one another. This not only takes advantage of the set design, it illustrates the constant reversals of plot and the character's psyches.


