## Local church has ties to assembly May 5-7

The Rev. Dan Cave and Allan and Jonel Carwell of St. John Lutheran Church in Farmington Hills will participate as voting members in the 1995 Assembly of the Southeast Michigan Synod, Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.

The meeting will be held at Cobo Conference Center in Detroit on May 5-7.

The assembly will gather under

the theme "Known by Christ - Making Christ Known."

The election of a bishop and synod officers will highlight the business portion of the meeting. The Rev. J. Phillip Wahl has served as bishop of the Southeast Michigan Synod for the past four years and is expected to be nominated for reelection.

The assembly will consider studies, social statements and strategies as well as items for-

warded by the synod's 155 congregations.

The assembly begins with a festival Eucharist at 7 p.m. Friday, May 5. Music will be provided by the Detroit Lutheran Singers.

Resolutions will address world hunger, anti-racism training, vision for ministry, the 25th anniversary of the ordination of women, and human sexuality.

The Rev. Lowell Almen, secretary of the Evangelical Lutheran

Church in America, and Christine Grumm, deputy secretary of the Lutheran World Federation, will be guest speakers at the assembly. Bible study will be led by the Rev. Mark Powell, associate professor of the New Testament, Trinity Lutheran Seminary, Columbus, Ohio.

About 500 clergy and lay members are expected to attend the 1995 assembly.

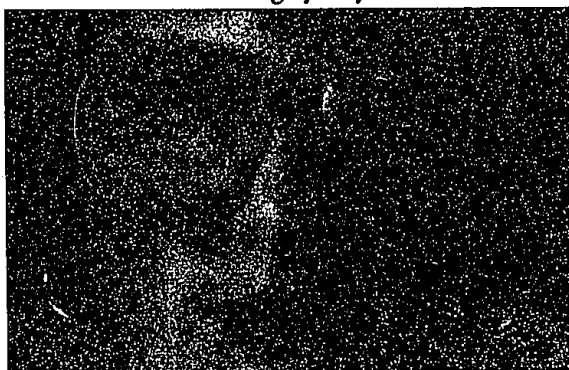
