


Finders are walkers

Notice of Public Hearing on Increasing Property Taxes and to Review The 1995-96 Proposed Budget

The City Council of the City of Farmington will hold a public hearing on a proposed increase of .1635 mills in the operating and limited debt tax millage rate to be levied in 1995.

The hearing will be held on Monday, June 5, 1995 at 8:00 p.m. at Farmington City Hall, Council Chambers, 23600 Liberty Street, Farmington, Michigan 48335.

The date and location of the meeting to take action on the proposed additional millage will be announced at this public meeting.

If adopted, the proposed additional millage will increase operating and limited debt revenues from ad valorem property taxes 1.5% over such revenues generated by levies permitted without holding a hearing. If the proposed additional millage rate is not approved, the operating and limited debt revenue will increase by .82% over the preceding year's operating revenue.

The maximum total proposed millage rate, including 3.0873 unlimited debt mills and 1.6 voted road mills, is 15.54 mills.

The taxing unit publishing this notice, and identified below, has complete authority to establish the number of mills to be levied from within its authorized millage rate.


