**HARRISON 3, NORTHVILLE 1:** Eric LaCasse threw a no-hitter Friday as unseasoned Farmington Hills Harrison escaped with a victory over visiting Northville.

The Hawks trailed 1-0 from the first inning until the bottom of the sixth when they rallied to score two runs.

Harrison is 5-0 in the Western Division of the Western Lakes Activities Association and 11-0 overall, Northville 1-6 and 1-10.

"We're surviving but we're surviving in a good way," Harrison coach Mike Trechman said, "because the girls are focusing when necessary and making big plays."

The excellent pitching of LaCasse and solid defense has enabled the Hawks to win a number of close games recently.

LaCasse struck out eight and walked two, but the defense did make one error that led to the Northville run. After

Mylinski had two hits and two RBI. Kristin Kozlarski had three stolen bases and scored three runs. Baringer and Hilary Foster had one RBI each with a hit and a sacrifice fly.

**GLENN 5, FARMINGTON 4:** The Falcons had their seven-game winning streak snapped Friday when Julie Bile hit a two-run homer in the bottom of the seventh inning.

Farmington is 5-2 in the Lakes Division with both losses to Glenn. Dina Aon hit a solo homer for the Falcons, 8-2 overall.

**SUMMARY OF ORDINANCE**

**NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE C-419-95, an Ordinance to Amend Chapter 31, Traffic and Motor Vehicles, of the City Code of Farmington to Prohibit (A) person less than 21 years of age) the Operation of a Motor Vehicle Upon a Highway or Other Place Open to the General Public or Generally Accessible to Motor Vehicles by Any Person Less Than 21 Years of Age Who Has Any Bodily Alcohol Content; To Provide Definitions, Procedures For Testing of Bodily Alcohol Content and the Legal Admissibility of Such Tests and to Provide Penalties for Violation Thereof.**

**THE CITY OF FARMINGTON ORDAINS:**

**Section 1.**

**Chapter 31, Traffic and Motor Vehicles, of the City Code, Section 31-303, is amended to read as follows:**

**Section 31-303. OPERATING UNDER INFLUENCE OF ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR OR CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE.**

**OPERATING WITH UNLAWFUL BLOOD ALCOHOL CONTENT; OPERATING WHILE VISIBLY IMPAIRED; ALCOHOL CONTENT OF MINORS; ATTEMPTS; PENALTIES.**

**Section 31-303.1. ALIQUOTS; PRELIMINARY CHEMICAL BREATH ANALYSIS; CHEMICAL TESTS AND ANALYSIS OF BLOOD, URINE OR BREATH - RIGHTS AND CONSEQUENCES OF REFUSAL; USE OF CHEMICAL TESTS RESULTS IN CIVIL OR CRIMINAL PROCEEDING; UNIFORM RULES FOR ADMINISTRATION OF CHEMICAL TESTS.**

**Section 31-303.2. ARRAIGNMENT; PRETRIAL CONFERENCE; DUTY OF COURT BEFORE ACCEPTING PLEA OF GUILTY OR NOLU CONTENDERE; SCREENING AND ASSESSMENT AS TO ALCOHOL OR DRUG ABUSE AND REHABILITATIVE SERVICES; LICENSE SURRENDER AND SANCTIONS; ISSUANCE OF RESTRICTED LICENSE.**

**Section 31-303.3. IMPLIED CONSENT TO CHEMICAL TESTS; CERTAIN PERSONS EXEMPT FROM BLOOD WITHDRAWAL.**

**Section 31-303.4. REFUSAL OF CHEMICAL TESTS - RIGHT OF DRIVER; REPORT TO SECRETARY OF STATE.**

**Section 31-303.5. REFUSAL TO SUBMIT TO CHEMICAL TESTS; NOTICE OF REPORT; REQUEST FOR HEARING; COUNSEL.**

**Section 31-303.6. EFFECT OR FAILURE TO REQUEST HEARING; HEARING PROCEDURE; NOTICE, APPEAL, NOTICE TO MOTOR VEHICLE ADMINISTRATOR OF ANOTHER STATE.**

**Section 31-303.7. DUTIES OF PEACE OFFICER IF PERSON REFUSES CHEMICAL TEST OR IF TEST REVEALS BLOOD ALCOHOL CONTENT OF .16% OR MORE.**

**Section 31-303.8. OPERATION OF COMMERCIAL VEHICLE BY PERSON WHOSE BLOOD CONTAINS 0.04% OR MORE BUT NOT MORE THAN 0.07% ALCOHOL; ARREST AT TIME OF ACCIDENT; VIOLATION AS MISDEMEANOR; SENTENCE; PRIOR CONVICTION DEFINED.**
