Two moms will receive awards this year from the Michigan Association of American Mothers Inc.

Lynn Romney Keenan, daughter of former Michigan governor George and Lenore Romney, will receive the State Mother of the Year Award. The Mother of Young Children Award goes to Michelle Engler, Michigan's first lady, wife of Gov. John Engler.

"We are proud to announce the winners of these awards. Both women are wonderful examples of what a mother should be," said Farmington Hills resident Chloe Ann Kelly, president of the association in Michigan.

Keenan received her bachelor's degree at Stanford University and did her graduate work in physical therapy. She is married to attorney Loren G. Keenan, and they have eight children and 21 grandchildren.

Keenan served on the Michigan Special Olympics Board of Directors for the past five years. She also served in many organizations of her church involving women and children.

Other involvement includes Red Cross, PTO president, Girl

Scouts and Cub Scouts.

"My dream has always been to be a wife and a mother. I love being a mother, and I'm very happy to be a part of AMI and the great standards they include," Keenan said.

Engler earned her bachelor's degree in government and a law degree at the University of Texas. She is admitted to the Michigan and Texas bar associations.

She gave birth to triplets in late 1994. Michelle Engler is chair of the Michigan Community Service Commission. She also is spokesperson for the Children's Trust Fund and is on the board of directors of the Library of Michigan Foundation and Michigan Cities

in Public Schools.
