GOP bill bashes trial lawyers

STATE Senate Republicans performed aggravated assault on the Michigan Trial Lawyer Association by passing a bill to cut product liability suits.

"This is about restoration of common sense," said Sen. Mike Rogers, R-Howell, charging that "we clog the courts with people who should not be there and are taking valuable resources and valuable time away from the victims who deserve to be compensated."

"It was the corporations that sold defective products that got away with murder," replied Sen. Alma Wheeler Smith, D-Salem.

The MTLA — whose members represent plaintiffs suing companies and local governments, and contribute heavily to Democratz — infuriated Republicans with full-page ads that said the bill would result in more Great Lekes relatifies. pollution.

The GOP bill hit the lawyers by limiting "contingency" fees under which lawyers collect one-third of a jury award rather than an hourly rate.

Wednesday's vote was 22 to 14. The bill goes to the House, where Republicans have a 56-53 edge, but a tighter battle is expected.

Voting yes were 21 Republicans and one Democrat. Republican David Honigman, an attorney from West Bloomfield, joined 13 Democrats in opposition. Two Detroit Democrats were absent. Except for Honigman, all area

Senators voted with their parties.
Senate Bill 344 will:

E Limit so-called "jury shopping" by requiring most suits to be filled where the injury occurred, not in Wayne County where corporate offices are located and juries are more generous.

E Allow juries to continue awarding economic damages (medical expenses and lost wayes). But it will cap "poin and suffering" swards at \$500,000 for death or loss of a vital hodily function and \$250,000 for other injuries.

B Junk the doctrine of "joint and

Bunk the doctrine of "joint and several liability," under which a "deep pockets" defendant that was 20 percent at fault could be required to pay 100 percent of the damages if other defendants were uncollectible.

Prohibit recovery by a plaintiff who was 50 percent or more at fault because of alcohol or drug

Sponsor Joel Gougeon, R-Bay City, cited a suit against West-land's city ice arens as a horrible example of how courts have turned business and government into "a form of social insurance."

In an April 21 docision, the state Court of Appeals ordered a trial in the case of Gary Singermen, who was playing goalle without a mask, struck in the eye by a deflected puck and injured. He charged the areas lighting was deflective. A circuit juried dismissed the case. Appellate Judge Marilyn Kelly of Bloomfield Hills wrote the 3-0 opinion that sent the case back for trial.

Sen. Gary Peters, D-Bloomfield Township, said Republicans failed to show there was a general problem in Michigan and relied solely on anecdotes. His dissent was Joined by Smith and George Z. Hart of Desrborn.

"Folks will remember the Ford Pinto with the exploding gas tank," and Peters — "27 deaths, 24 sorious burn injuries. It all could have been prevented for \$11 per car. The outragoous part is the Ford Motor Co. knew very well there were probably some problems with that gas tank, but they did not worry because it met government standards," a defense under \$18 344. "But government standards at the time dealt only with front-end collisions, not back-end collisions."

Peters said the manufacturer of the Dalkon shield intrauterine device may have escaped 300,000 claims under the "sophisticated user" defense in SB 344.

"And the reason (haby) pajamas have flame retardant material on them is because of a law-suit," Peters said, concluding: "Michigan can be a dumpling ground for defective products from around the world, whether they're from Talwan, Dominican Republic or Hong Kong" because of the strong legal defenses given manufacturors.
