employee, unless the appropriate government agency consents after consultation.

Donohue said a law firm, in which one attorney may have a conflict with a firm's interests or client, will in the jargon of the profession, "build a Chinese wall" around that attorney to make sure

he does not have access to information that might compromise the attorney, firm or client.

Lichtman said the job move has nothing to do with the Timbercrest project.
