ago, he envisioned an allAmerican bistro with a traditional "bar and grill" menu.
What he hadn't counted on
was the anticipation and expoctation of customers that
Joe's Bar & Grill would offer
the same fresh fish and scafood
made famous by the original
Joe Muer's Restaurant in Detroit.

Responding to customers'
requests, Muer has changed
the menu to include many of
the entire selections that are
customary at the Detroit resteurant.

Preparation is identical to the downtown location save for some minor changes in style and presentation.

Gone are the non-Muer en-trees like pork tenderloin and tuna marinated in hoisin and

The seafood dominated menu, now printed daily, offers skinleas saute perch, white-fish, live Maine lobster and clam chowders.

Muer says the new name more accurately reflects the neu selections.

As one customer put it, "I know what to expect when I see the name Muer.

"What customers have come to expect is not in keeping with a bar and grill in the traditional sense," said partner Chick Taylor. "The name change was necessary for a variety of other reasons, not the least of which was the confusion it caused."

Taylor says the restaurant is striving for consistency in "quality food preparation and service," a characteristic he acknowledges was lacking when the restaurant first opened.

"All businesses suffer growing pains, and we were no different than any other," he said.
