Councilman Jon Bates, a strong



The cleanup is part of an area-wide effort to clear the river from debris and logiams that have come about over the years. About 50 city employees will take part in the cleanup, many of them using equipment such as chain saws. Volunteers will be doing strictly manual labor.

The festive atmosphere of the event has helped to make the tradition both successful and enjoyable, Bates said.
