Hills OK's '95-'96 budget

The Fermington Hills City Council approved the 1995-96 budget May 30, adding three new sidewalk projects that won't affect the tax rate. The city's operating budget is \$32,600,049.

Residents will pay an increase of up to 2.1 percent and an aver-

age of 1.7 percent based on the value of their property. The new tax rate is 9.165 mills, up from 9.1409 mills. The owner of a home valued at \$100,000 would pay no more than \$26.24 in additional taxes with the increase.

The council moved up three sidewalk projects that will fill in

gaps in the city's aldewalk sys-tem. A sidewalk from Ballmoral to Linconhine will cost \$24,000, a gap filler on 10 Mile between Middlebelt and Inkster will cost \$50,000 and a sidewalk gap filler on Druke between 13 and 14 Mile will cost \$16,000. The money will come from the cantial funtrove-
