Hills OK's '95-'96 budget

The Farmington Hills City Council approved the 1995-96 budget May 30, adding three new sidewalk projects that won't affect the tax rate.

The city's operating budget is \$32,600,049.

Residents will pay an increase of up to 2.1 percent and an aver-

age of 1.7 percent based on the value of their property. The new tax rate is 9.165 mills, up from 9.1409 mills. The owner of a home valued at \$100,000 would pay no more than \$26.24 in additional taxes with the increase.

The council moved up three sidewalk projects that will fill in

gaps in the city's sidewalk system. A sidewalk from Ballmorat to Lincolnshire will cost \$24,000, a gap filler on 10 Mile between Middlebelt and Inlander will cost \$50,000 and a sidewalk gap filler on Drake between 13 and 14 Mile will cost \$18,000. The money will come from the capital improvement fund.

POLICE/FIRE CALLS

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

FIRE

Farmington Hills firefighters from Station 4 put out a fire in a 1983 Buick Riviera in a lot on 12 Mile in Farmington Hills at 7:43 p.m. June 4. The car's owner said the Buick stalled and then ran sluggishly when he re-started the car. He pulled it over, looked under the hood and discovered that the engine was on fire. He ran to a nearby gas station and called 9-1-1. The car, insured for \$10,000, was a total loss.

The owner of a 1986 Ford Bronco discovered the engine compartment on fire at 10:04 a.m. June 3. The fire took place while the Bronco was stopped at the light on Middlebelt at Northwestern and another driver told the owner his vehicle was on fire. Farmington Hills firefighters from Station 2 put out the fire, which caused \$200 damage to the contents and totaled the Bronco (\$8,000).

Farmington Hills firefighters from Station 1 put out an engine fire in a 1994 car at the Green Hills Apartments on Green Hill in Farmington Hills at 7:16 p.m. June 5. The fire started while the car was in a carport. It caused \$11,000 in damage to the carport and \$14,000 in damage to the car. Farmington firefighters put out an electrical fire in a 1988 Dodge Omni parked in the Kmart parking lot on Grand River at 6:02 p.m. June 4. The car worth \$1,500 was a total loss.

THEFTS

The tires and wheels were stolen from a blue 1992 Corvette parked on Green Hill in Farmington Hills June 1-2, causing \$250 in damage.
