## Achilles injury: quite common

As I was running across the tennis court, it felt like something had hit the beck of my leg just above my hed. Wow'I tould even hear the pop. The immediate pain told me I had as d problem bad problem — achilles tendon rupture. Is this

common? Tupure. Is this is not an uncommon injury for a tennia player over 30 years old. Tennia is a stop-start activity — sudden acceleration/deceleration and changing direction frequently will cause this tenden tear. Racquethall is a killer and skiing, bakethall and football are sports where this injury is most common.

Men more frequently are injured. Ruptures can happen to runners, but are more likely to be a flexibility problem than an age problem. Achilles tendon problems generally come from overloading or overusing.

Overloading means there is some extrinsic factor that concontrates the stress on the area. This can come from incorrect technique or improper training. Overuse means there is no one factor that can be corrected. The area is just overused.

The bottom line for prevention is to warm up properly before your activity. After warming up with a march, spend a few minutea stretching all areas of the leg holding each stretch at least 30 acconds. If your lower leg starts to get sore during the activity, you must stop and ice it.
