

### World travelers set sail

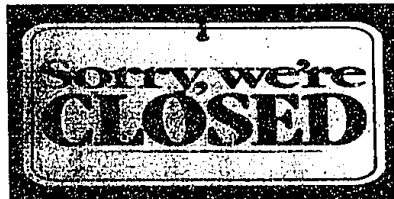
