

POLICE/FIRE CALLS

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

FIRE DEPARTMENT RUNS

Farmington Hills firefighters made 106 runs for the week of June 12-18. Of those, 55 were medical emergencies (52 percent) and 14 were fires (13 percent), including six car fires.

EMBEZZLEMENT

Deposits of \$1,700 at Arby's restaurant on Haggerty in Farmington Hills were missing May 25.

THEFTS

A cellular phone worth \$300 was stolen from the Michigan Institute for Neurological Development on Orchard Lake in Farmington Hills June 16.

A \$10,000 air conditioning and heating unit was stolen from the roof of Silverman's restaurant on Orchard Lake in Farmington Hills June 13.

Three patio chairs (\$300) were stolen from the deck of a house on Glenbrook in Farmington Hills June 17.

Almost \$23,000 in checks and cash were stolen from Fresh Approach on Grand River in Farmington June 19. A store employee had taken a check out of the store safe to make a correction and left money and checks on a desk and the safe door open when she went to help at a checkout line between 10:10-20 a.m. When she returned and replaced the check, she saw that the checks and money were gone.

A beaded purse with diamond and gold earrings and a necklace (\$3,367) were stolen from Adat Shalom Synagogue on Middlebelt in Farmington Hills May 28.

VANDALISM

Two windows were broken at a house on Raleigh in Farmington Hills June 16-17, causing \$200 in damage.

A second-floor balcony glass door was broken (\$160) at a residence on Maple Nut in Farmington Hills June 19.

BREAK-INS

The passenger door window was broken, causing \$300 in damage to a green 1995 Chrysler Cirrus parked at Loehmann's on Orchard Lake in Farmington Hills, and a \$50 cellular phone was stolen June 17.

The passenger window of a 1995 Olds Aurora on Alycekey in Farmington Hills was broken and the car's AM/FM stereo was damaged (\$1,300) and a \$50 cellular phone was stolen June 18.

The passenger window was smashed (\$300) on a green 1994 Nissan Maxima parked at the Gateway Apartments on Gateway, and a \$200 food processor, \$200 videocassette recorder, \$200 men's clothes and other items (\$320) were stolen June 17-18. Door handles were damaged (\$400) during an attempted break-in of the concession stand at the Founders Sports Park on Eight Mile in Farmington Hills June 17-18.

DRUNKEN DRIVING

Farmington Hills police arrested a Farmington man, 17, after a high-speed chase, for drunken driving and fleeing and eluding at 12:25 a.m. June 19 on Briar Hill near 10 Mile. Officers began following a blue 1991 Pontiac Sunbird that was weaving while driving east on 10 Mile. After police attempted to pull the car over, he slowed down as if to stop, then accelerated, driving through residential areas at 60-70 mph. The car went off the road and landed on its side. The driver was taken to Botsford General Hospital and treated for minor injuries.

Farmington Hills police arrested a Southfield man, 26, for drunken driving at 10:05 a.m. June 19 on Nine Mile west of Middlebelt. Police stopped a blue 1990 Mercury Sable that was swerving and had crossed the center line twice. The man had a blood alcohol level of .24 percent. A level of .1 percent or more is considered too drunk to drive in Michigan.

Farmington Hills police arrested a Detroit man, 26, for drunken driving at 11:55 p.m. June 19 on eastbound Grand River at Jackson. The blue 1993 Chevy Cavalier he was driving had been weaving. He had a blood alcohol level of .17 percent.

Farmington Hills firefighters from Station 2 put out an engine fire of a 1990 Mercury Sable parked in the driveway of a residence on Middlebelt at 11:48 a.m. June 15. The fire caused \$3,000 in damage to the car.

Farmington Hills firefighters from Station 3 responded to a water heater fire at a residence on Tule in Farmington Hills at 6:06 p.m. June 14. The fire started when plumbers attempted to ignite the water heater with a propane torch. Paper insulation and PVC piping caught fire, filling the room with smoke. The fire damaged drywall and sanitary piping, and charred structural timbers. Damage was estimated at \$2,000 to the property and \$500 to contents.

Farmington Hills firefighters from Station 1 put out a trailer fire on Haggerty in Farmington Hills at 2:29 p.m. June 14. Bales of hay and compressed, recycled paper had caught fire in the trailer owned by American Landscaping Services of Ray, Mich. Damage to the trailer was estimated at \$500 and damage to contents was \$500.

Farmington Hills firefighters from Station 4 extinguished an engine fire in a 1987 Buick Skylark parked in front of Mark Shopnick Jewelers on Orchard Lake in Farmington Hills at 1:27 p.m. June 18. The car, valued at \$1,000, was totaled.

Farmington Hills firefighters from Station 1 put out a fire in a 1980 Ford Granada on Cadillac in Farmington Hills at 9:35 a.m. June 18 caused by a fuel leak. Damage to the car was \$300.

Farmington Hills firefighters from Station 3 responded to a reported fire at Larkshire School on Tuck in Farmington Hills at 9:30 p.m. June 18. The fire was started in a field by the school using sticks and other ground cover material. There was no damage and the party responsible was arrested by police at the scene.

Farmington Hills firefighters from Stations 1 and 4 responded to a report of smoke in a residence on Woodbridge Circle in Farmington Hills at 9:24 a.m. June 19. The smoke came from a faulty air conditioning unit. Damage to the property was estimated at \$250 and damage to the contents was \$500.

A black 1987 Dodge Raider station wagon worth \$4,000 was stolen from Oak Valley Court in Farmington Hills June 20.

A 1980 Ford Granada (\$3,100) was stolen from the lot of O'Shuck's Bar and Grill on Grand River in Farmington Hills June 17.

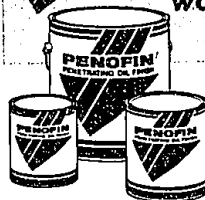
