Woodland Hills Park to open late July

Construction of a gravel driveway and 24-car parking lot leading into Woodland Hills Park is underway, according to Dan Potter, Farmington Hills director of special services.

Parking lot construction and the first phase of trail development is scheduled to be completed by the end of July allowing the park to open to the public for the first time since development began.

Woodland Hills Park is a "passive park" where the study of nature can take place. Farmington Hills Naturalist Joe Derek calls the park "an outdoor classroom without walls with an ever-changing natural curriculum."

According to Derek, most metropolitan development projects have not considered woodlands and wetlands to be valuable assets worthy of concern. Farmington Hills has been an exception.

Initial park development included the identification of the existing wetlands and the creation of a man-made wetland, according to Assistant City Manager Dave Call.

This area which includes a pond is located at the west side of the park. The area has added features that were not originally part of the park land and has provided habitat for additional wildlife.

Trails are under development leading to the wetlands and throughout the park. Continued trail development will take place after the park opens using volunteers, workers from interested groups, and workers from the court work program.

"By playing our role as stewards of our environment," Derek said, "we are preserving Woodland Hills in its natural state for generations to come."

Woodland Hills is located on the west side of Farmington Road, south of I-696. Entrance to the park is located across from the entrance to Oakland Community College.
