- Pocus completely on satisfy-ing the customer.
- 2. Study the success of others.
- 3. Gather and analyze management information regularly. (Develop systems to monitor information about financial, customer industry and market trends.)
- Sharpen marketing skills.
 (Work the six P's: price, product or service, place, promotion, peo-ple and positioning.)
- Increase customer's perception of value. (Use variable pricing strategies to match discounter's prices on price-sensitive "visible" (tems.)
- Position the business uniquely. (Carve out a section of the market where you can out-de-liver competitors.)
- Eliminate waste. (Plan spending, create budgeta.)
- 8. Find something to improve
- 9. Embrace change with a posi-tive attitude.
- 10. Finish analysing, take action.
