

A new era is dawning Monday at Walled Lake's two high

schools.

Jerry Hartsock takes over Monday as the Walled Lake Central principal, succeeding Dennis Champnella. At Walled Lake Western, longtime educator Richard Smith will hand over the reins to Gary Bredahl, currontly Michigan's principal of the year for his efforts at Lansing Everett High School.

"We've gotten not only very good, akilled, articulate, experienced principals, we've found two people who will meet the individual needs of each building at this time," said Lols Lange, the Walled Lake Consolidated School District's director of personnel and community relations.

Both new principals — who were subjected to a vigorous and thorough screening/interviewing process — were the cream of a 40-applicant pool of candidates, board president David Flammer said.

Flammer said he thinks Bredshi will bring a "more traditional supproach. But as is evident by his principal of the year award, he a strong leader."
