atretches of brick work, which are a city requirement for historic sites — in front of the Kirby White house at the corner of 10 Mile and in front of the Botsford House.

"You can't even see it from the house," Allen said.

Now that the link from 1-606 is complete said the link from lieritage Park to 10 Mile is finished, the next step will be completion of a separate bridge over 1-656, that will link the city's north and south, Owell said.

"We will be accepting bids on Monday (July 10)," Otwell said.

"Work should start on that by August and be completed in October."

The bridge, the path from 1-696 to Heritage and the path from the park to 10 Mile are all heavily funded by federal nonmotorized transportation grants. The links are part of a plan to meet recreation demands for a bike path. A city survey taken in 1990 found that more than 65 percent of those responding wanted a bike path to link the city. With more than 30 percent of Americans riding bikes and the continuing increase in popularity of bike riding, the path will help meet that after.
