The time of the race was the fastest by any amateur driving a trotter, and the quickest mile by a woman in any trotting race, amateur or pro, according to the U.S. Trotting Association.

McIlmurray said hitting the finish line after going wire-towire was an emotional experience.

"I was hooting and hollering," she said. "I looked over at the time and know we were smoking, but I didn't think that fast. It was quite a thrill."


