Truth is, they would love to end up like Taormins. In the last year alone she has abattered world records in five events in Master's competition: 1,500-meter free-style, 400 free, 100 free, 200 free and 100 butterfly.

Greg Phill, who coached Taor-mins at Stavenson and welcomed the call to train her again last fall, just shakes his head in amaza-ment.

"She is in the best shape of her life right now," he said. "And she is swimming the best times of her life. Does she have a realistic shot at making the Olympic team? Yes, I truly believe she doos."

Taomina's target is a spot on the newly created 800-meter free-style relay team. The U.S. Olym-pic team will carry six 200-free-tylers for the event.
