

Man charged in robbery

A Detroit man, 33, has been charged in the July 5 armed robbery of a Clark Station in Farmington.

Donald Ray Baggett was arraigned on charges of armed robbery before 47th District Court Magistrate Joan Dudley July 22. A not guilty plea was entered.

Preliminary exam is set for 1:30 p.m. Wednesday, Aug. 2, before Judge Maria Parker.

Baggett is being held in Oakland County Jail. Cash bond is set at \$25,000.

In the robbery, the gunman fired three shots into the air outside while fleeing on foot outside the station at Farmington and Nine Mile, Farmington police said.

The robber escaped with \$100 cash after he handed the attendant a note, demanding she empty the drawer within 15 seconds, police reported. He pulled a blue revolver from his pants pocket and laid it flat on the counter.

A man matching the description of the robber was seen at a nearby Amoco station on Farmington Road shortly before the robbery. It is believed the man bought a pack of cigarettes there and left.

He is being questioned in other robberies, police said.

Hills police arrested Baggett after the 1983 Ford Escort he was a passenger in was stopped on Grand River near Halsted for having a loud exhaust.

Police found marijuana and a black revolver in the vehicle's glove box.
