New resident wins Hills race

Guy Murray was on the move
Saturday.

Murray began the day by win
ning the Heart of the Hills 10k
race in Bloomfield Hills. Later on
the packed his belongings and
moved from Clawson to Farmington Hills.

Murray had a lot more company in the morning as he was one
of nearly 1,000 racers who participacted in the 10th annual Heart of
the Hills race that started and
ended on the Bloomfield Hills
Andover High School track.

A bend track coach at the University of Detroit-Mercy College,
Murray won with a time of 33:01.

David Chomet of Southfield was
second at 32:10 and Keith Stopen
of Farmington Hills placed third
in 33:30.

It was second overall victory in four years for Murray, who also took the 1992 championship. The 25-year-old racer earned runner-up bonors in 1933 and 1994.
Murray said his experience and course knowledge aided his victo-

ry.
"I know where the hill parts are and the flat parts are," said Murray, who plans to run in the Free

Press International Marathon this fall. "I was in the lead group, but I just waited till I hit the flat part (of the course) to make my move.

"I was kind of tired through the first part of the course and I took the lead just before the three-mile mark," he said. "This is a good, challenging course. They do a great job here of putting it on."

The overall women's 10k winner was Romeo's Nancy Collister, who registered a time of 39-02. She was followed by Renea Bluckamp of Birmingham (40-32) and Deb Froehlich of Warren (40-40).

In the 5K race, David Barnett, 21, of Ann Arbor won in 15;52. Grett Sanborn, 28, of Royal Oak was accord in 16:32 while Chris Constantino of Sterling Heights placed third in 16:49.

The overall women's 5k winner was Birmingham's Nicole Eberle. Royal Oak's Tammy Sanborn was second in 21:52 and Rochester Adams graduate Erica Halliday, who now attends Hillsdale Collows was this kin 20:11. lege, was third in 22:17.

Eberie, 19, participated in the 10k run two years ago and medaled in the 5k race last year. This was her first 5k title.

"I didn't know I was in the lead until after the two mile mark," said Eberle, who ran a 6:53-mile pace. "It was nice to win it. There's good competition here.

"This is a good race. It's nice and hilly and it's good training for cross country in the fall," said Eberle, a 1933 Birmingham Marian graduate who is now on the cross country team at Central Michigan University.

Ed Kozloff of the Motor City Striders said the Heart of the Hills race — voted one of the top races by Michigan Runner maga-zine — has become one of the most popular events on the sum-mer schedule.

"The runners love the course, which is hilly and challenging," said Korloff, "Runners like flat courses, but this race is nice because of the diversity of the hills.

"This is unique to many road races because it starts and ends on a track. It makes the start and finish a faster race," he said.


