

# Madonna has record number of recruits

If bigger is better, then Madonna University's baseball team is on a fast track to success.

Not that the Fighting Crusaders could avoid it. With a team featuring a rebuilt infield and just four seniors, they posted a 39-25 overall record in '95 and reached the final three in the NIAA Great Lakes Regional, their best post-season performance ever.

So, a year after rebuilding the infield, Madonna coach Mike George must do the same in the outfield.

The shouldn't be much of a problem. George will have plenty to choose from with the recruiting class he has coming in — the largest in number (17) by far since George began the program.

And that number does not include two redshirts George hopes to have join the team, right-handed pitcher Monte Travita and catcher Delano Voletti.

If he had stopped his efforts with just Dearborn Divine Child graduates, George could very probably have termed it a success. From the team many thought was the finest in the state last year, in any class, George has signed three players.

That doesn't include Voletti, also a Divine Child graduate.

The leader of the Falcon grads is Aaron Shrewsbury, a 6-foot-2, 245-pound right-handed first baseman whom George hopes will "provide some of the offensive punch we're losing."

The other two DC recruits are both right-handed pitchers: Joel Fabris and Joe Bligg.

Two of his recruits are from Oberlin-area schools: Eric Marotte, a shortstop from Plymouth Canton who played last year at Henry Ford CC, and Joe Niesztro, a catcher/pitcher/third baseman from Redford Thurston.

As for the others, once again George pursued pitchers.

What George did get were some left-handers: Mitch Jabzenaki, Novi; Jason Ayoitte, Walled Lake Western; Jeff

Warholik, Alpena; and Eric Crawford, Davison. Of the four, George thinks Jabzenaki could contribute on the mound right away.

Additional right-handed pitchers are Bob Hamp, a Class A all-stater from Alpena; Bob Mason, South Lyon; and Tom Suttler, a U.S. Air Force veteran. E.J. Roman, from Orchard Lake St. Mary's, is a right-hander who bats left and who can catch and play third base, too.

And Kevin Sullivan, a pitcher/first baseman/third baseman from Riverview Christian, whose size (6-1, 220) indicates "he's going to provide some offensive punch for us."

Helping fill the voids in the outfield will be Mark Taylor, from Gibraltar Carlton, and Bob Leon, from Roswell and Macomb Community College.

DCD's Jeremy Harkins, who is headed to Butler, suffered a knee injury in the regional final. He played in the national semifinal substituting for defender Dave Stanovich (Troy Athens/University of Detroit Mercy), who had to sit out because of a red-card suspension handed out in the regional final.

"He (Harkins) had to sweep for us the first game and was our MVP," the Vardar coach said. "We couldn't have won that game without him and he showed a lot of courage out there."

Other players include backup keeper Jeff Atkin (Sterling Heights), forward Steve Corder (St. Clair Shores/U-D Mercy), forward Joe DiMaggio (Washington/ACAC) and Steve Trammittin (Ann Arbor Pioneer/Vanderbilt).

Sixteen of the 17 players saw action in the two USVA national

games. "We were kind of like the Oakland Raiders, on and off the field," Lupencio said. "Sometimes practices were brutal and a lot of times I had to break up fights. "We had eight new players this year. It was sometimes the national champs against the national 'wannabes' because some hadn't won a national title before."

# Family ties aid 'Cats' playoff drive

For the Huskies (3-9), Dustin Swoody had two goals. Eric Klutas (Canton) had a goal and an assist, and Kevin Desautels had a goal




