

POLICE/FIRE CALLS

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

FIRE

Farmington Hills firefighters from Station 1 put out an engine fire in a 1991 GMC Typhoon on the southbound shoulder of I-275 at Grand River at 2:30 p.m. Aug. 10. The owner told firefighters that he was driving the GMC home from the car dealership af-

ter having trouble with its electrical system when smoke started coming from the engine area. The \$16,000 vehicle was totaled.

FIRE DEPARTMENT RUNS
Farmington Hills firefighters made 89 runs for the week of Aug. 7-13 including 45 medical emergencies (51 percent), six fires and six rescue calls.

BREAK-INS
A \$300 Brother fax machine and

A level of .1 percent is considered too drunk to drive in Michigan.

Farmington Hills police arrested a Hills man, 42, for drunken driving at 2:23 a.m. Aug. 14 after his grey 1985 Pontiac Parisian jumped the curb on Middlebelt while pulling into the parking lot of the 7-Eleven store. The man had a blood alcohol level of .27 percent.

Farmington police arrested a Detroit man, 25, for drunken driving at 1:13 a.m. Aug. 13 at Freedom and Fleming. Police stopped the 1979 Buick for not having its headlights on. The driver had a blood alcohol level of .21 percent at the scene. He was ticketed after refusing to take a blood alcohol test at the station.

Farmington police arrested a Westland man, 29, for drunken driving at 9:11 p.m. Aug. 12 at Farmington and North Manor. Police pulled over the 1980 Ford Thunderbird for drifting. The driver had a blood alcohol level of .23 percent.

Farmington police arrested a Farmington woman, 24, for drunken driving and leaving the scene of an accident Aug. 14. Police responded to a hit-and-run accident at Lakeway and Valley View. Witnesses described the vehicle as blue in color. Officers followed a trail of fluid at the scene to Prospect Street where a 1988 Chevy Beretta was spotted with heavy front-end damage. The driver admitted to being in an accident and had a blood alcohol level of .18 percent.

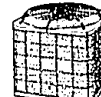
