

Hills resident linked to sex assault on teen

Farmington police are seeking warrants for a Farmington Hills man, 35, in connection with the June 16 sexual assault of a 16-year-old girl in the Downtown Center parking lot.

The victim was positively identified a man matching the description of the attacker, who was naked and wearing a mask at the time of the incident in a parking lot near T.J. Marx. The teen, who was in-line skating, was dragged behind a trash bin where she was forced to have oral sex and had her breasts grabbed during the assault.

The man is being held in Oakland County Jail on felonious assault and fleeing and eluding charges stemming from an inde-

cent exposure case in West Bloomfield.

Farmington police detectives followed several leads since the June 16 assault. Most tips have centered on the attacker's vehicle, which was described as an older model station wagon.

Farmington police are seeking warrants for two counts of first-degree criminal sexual conduct and one count of second degree CSC.

West Bloomfield police arrested a Farmington Hills man after a male was seen standing naked in front of a window at Henry Ford Medical Center-West Bloomfield Aug. 13.

West Bloomfield police stopped a vehicle leaving the scene on Maple Road, east of Draks. The driver sped off, leading police on a chase east on Maple and south on

Farmington Road before losing control. He was captured trying to flee on foot.

He pleaded not guilty to charges of indecent exposure, felonious assault, malicious destruction of property and fleeing and eluding during his arraignment in 48th District Court Aug. 14.

He is being held in Oakland County Jail on \$50,000 bond. He's also in custody on a parole violation stemming from a 1992 conviction for breaking and entering of a vehicle.

Police found four pairs of panty hose in his vehicle.

West Bloomfield police have received four reports of indecent exposure since June, including three at Henry Ford Medical Center. The man in those incidents was nude and wearing a stocking.






