## DR. SHIKH M. SAIED

Dr. Saied, 62, of Farmington Hills died Aug. 31 in a boating accident in Canada.

Dr. Saied was division head of Hematopathology and Transfusion Medicine and director of the Blood Bank at Henry Ford Hospital since 1976. He authored numerous scientific articles and abstracts and conducted workshops on blood disorders and issues related to blood transfusions.

Throughout his career, Dr. Saied held office in state, regional and national organizations. They include past chairman of the Blood Banking Committee for the Michigan Society of Pathologists and past president of the Michigan Association of Blood Banks.

He served on numerous committees and held offices for the American Association of Blood Banks, the College of American Pathologists, the Southeastern Michigan American Red Cross, the American National Red Cross and the Southeastern Michigan Blood Services Region.

Dr. Saied was a Fellow of the College of American Pathologists and the American Society of Clinical Pathologists as well as a member of the American Association of Blood Banks, the American Society of Hematology and

the Hematopathology Society.

Dr. Saied received his medical degree from King Edward Medical College in Lahore, Pakistan, and served residencies in pathology at Hillcrest Medical Center in Tulsa, Oklahoma and Henry Ford Hospital.

Survivors include his wife, Ju- zhee, and four children.

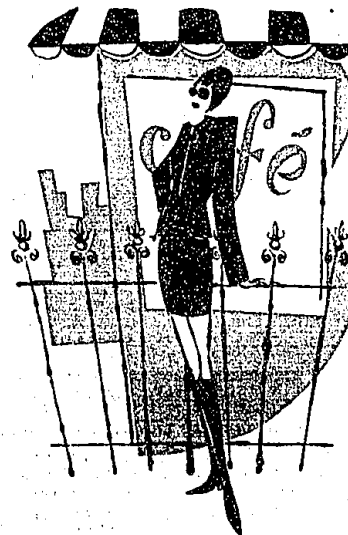
