

POLICE/FIRE CALLS

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

**RECOVERED VEHICLE**  
Farmington Hills police recovered a blue 1995 Dodge Dakota at 8:30 a.m. Sept. 8 that had been stolen from a Montclair resident. The pickup is worth \$12,000.

**FRAUD**  
A resident on Pheasant Run in Farmington Hills told police that a woman claiming to be a stock broker convinced her to write a check for \$2,000 to be invested in Microsoft stock on Aug. 20. The check was cashed but no stock was purchased.

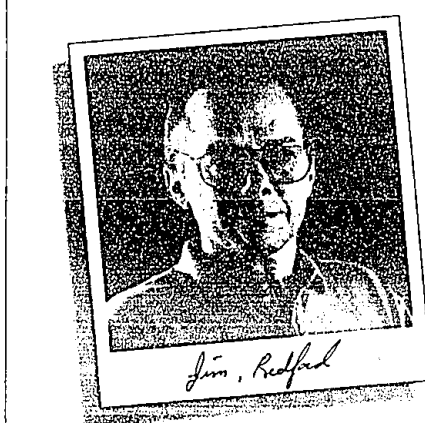
