From the photo, there appears to be another impress mark near the rear of the lion, which isn't clear in the photo. the lion, which last clear in the photo-if this is in fact a shield with a lower-case letter, the piece can be further dated as having been made from 1902 to 1914. A lowercase letter "c" indicates 1902, "d" indicates 1903, and so on to an "o" for 1914. The numbers probably indicate mold and/or pattern numbers. Most English pottery and porcelain can be identified in a similar manner. This is a very collectible piece, and if in good condition could be priced around \$850

FOCUS ON PHOTOGRAPHY

Hold your camera properly



How you hold your camera when you pho-tograph is important to obtaining sharp pictures. Camera movement during exposure is one of the most frequent causes of unsharp photos. Too often, I've seen ama-teur photographers jerk the shutter release button and what could dreaming nicture is prize-winning picture is

hopeiessiy lost to camera jiggles.

There are some simple techniques you can follow when not using a tripod to minimize the shakes and maximize the chances of steady and sharp pic-

tures.

To start with, hold your camera in a way that's both comfortable and steady. If right-handed, grasp the right side of your camera in your right hand with your forefinger gently resting on the shutter release. Cup the camera body nour loft palm with your fingers on the focusing ring. For left-handers, just reverse the positions.

Keep your syms and elbows against

verse the positions.

Keep your arms and elbows egainst
your body, not suspended in air. Stand
firmly on the ground with your feet
slightly wider than shoulder width.
Hold your comera tightly against your

face, take a breath, hold it, and gently squeeze the shutter release. Chances are you'll make a picture free from cam-

era movement.

Even try bracing yourself against a nearby tree or set your camera atop a fence post or car roof to improve sharp-

What shutter speed should you use? It depends on the size of the lens you're using. A general rule is to use a shutter speed equal to or faster than the focal speed equal to restor than the tops speed equal to restor example, use a shutter speed of 1/60 second or faster when using a normal 50mm lons. At 1/250 second speed should be used with a 200mm lens and a 1/15 second or faster

200mm lens and a 1/15 accord or faster with a 17mm wide angle lens.
With zoom lenses, this guideline still holds true. Just use a shutter speed close to wherever you've set your zoom.
A golfer will practice his or her swing and how to properly hold the club. A marksman will practice squeezing the trigger. Photographers, too, should practice their handling and shooting techniques.




