Electric technologies dispose of waste

A typical hospital produces about 210 tons of medical waste each year. Moreover, U.S. hospitals and clinics create about one and a half million tons of medical waste annually.

Traditional disposal methods have proved costly — for both the heapitals and the environment. To get rid of it, they burn it, sterilize it with steam, disinfect it with chemicals or send it to landfills.

But burning the waste spews fumes into the air, and landfills are filling up. Many on-site incinerators are outdated, have little or no emission controls, and would need costly modi-fications to comply with strict federal

laws.

Electric utilities and the health
care industry are developing new electric products and systems to dispose
of medical waste more efficiently.

They eliminate medical waste with-out burning or dumping, according to the Edison Electric Institute and the National Rural Electric Cooperative Association, representing America's electric utilities.

They also keep contaminants out of the air and reduce the waste volumes disposed at landfills-that's better for our environment.

The Bio-Oxidizer is one, new elec-tric solution. It destroys biohazar-dous waste without burning it. The treatment produces a sterile, inorgan-ic residue that cannot leach into groundwater. The technology can even reuse about 80 percent of the en-

ergy it consumes.

The hospital recycles this to heat
the facility's water. The first Bio-Oxfdizer was installed at Pennsylvania's
Chambersburg Hospital, with the

help of West Penn Power, the local electric utility. The unit now reduces the hospital's waste by 98 percent of its original volume, at about half the cost of previous disposal methods. Another electric product, the microwave, can also be used to disinfect medical waste. The treatment processes up to 550 pounds of material per hour, and has been used successfully in Europe for more than five years.

The Bio-Oxidizer and microwave are two of several new electric products being developed and used to treat many kinds of wasto. Others are now used to treat wastewater, disinfect dinking water, and other applications.
