His transfer is not part of overall brain drain in Detroit schools education, he said.

"If the question is, 'Is there a mass exodus from Detroit to suburban school districts?' I'd say no," said Jones, who is only aware of two other Detroit administrators to leave. "There is a lot of competent and capable teachers and administrators in the Detroit schools."

Jones grew up in Detroit and graduated from MacKenzie High. He wanted to go to Cass Tech but waited past the deadline to enroll. Jones lives in the city with his wife, Janet. They have one daughter, 23, who is studying chemical engineering at Wayne State University.

His North Farmington job will include the usual tasks, including
