Godwin said the student had Godwin said the student had been working on projects involv-ing prestitutes and AIDS at the Wayne County Correctional Fa-cility in Hamtramek at the time, as well as areas where prestitutes

as well as areas where prostitutes worked.

"She was dealing with people she normally would not have," he said of her research.

Officers have questioned a number of people, including Kenneth Tranchida, an ex-convict who was found with the keys to her car.

Tranchida, a Southfield resident, told police he though Bigger was out of town visiting friends, according to Detective Bob Tiderington. That was after the disappearance and before officers found the car.
