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## Pedestrian program to honor city

The city of Farmington will be honored at a 10 a.m. ceremony, Tuesday, Sept. 26, as a winner in the 56th-annual AAA Michigan Pedestrian Protection Program. A 9 a.m. breakfast will precede the awards ceremony.

"With nearly 2,300 cities nationwide entered in this competi-

tion, we are proud to recognize the city of Farmington with a Pedestrian Safety Commendation award for excellence in pedestrian safety," said AAA Michigan Community Safety Services manager Jerry Basch. "Ensuring the safety of pedestrians is clearly a priority in this community."

In determining awards, a panel of traffic safety judges considered pedestrian death and injury rates, legislation, enforcement efforts, traffic engineering, school and traffic safety programs, public information and education. The entrants were categorized by population.

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
