generations," said Palechok, who teaches horticulture in the Farm-ington Adult Education program.

Her grandfather, who lived with her parents, was an avid gardener along with her mother and father, who dug a few beds at her home on "Springvale in Farmington Hills before he died.

"There were three people in the house who gardened," said Palechek, a master gardener. Her husband, Doug is also a master

Her landscape is patterned af-ter English gardens featuring a lot

of mixed beds with a mixture of perennials, evergreens, bulbs, annuals and many varieties of grass.
"So, when someone passes there's something always to look at," she added.
Ross and Nancy Smith, who won runner-up in the garden category of the contest, also have an English, country style garden on Fiddlers Green in Farmington Hills with plants mixed together and densely planted.
His secret is to use pots and move the blooming plants around for variety and color depending on what clse is happening in the gar-

den.
"I also compost everything in

"I also compost everything in the yard and recycle it," he added. "You've got to keep the plants to the right moisture." White and yellow moon flowers — that grow 5 feet high and 5 feet wide — are his favorite annual flower.

He estimates that he does a lot

more work on his garden in the spring than any other time of year.

Laura DeFore, a runner-up in the garden category, also works more in her garden during the spring than any other time of

year.

"It's really relaxing for my husband, Chester, and I," she said adding that the focus of the garden at her home on Buckingham in Fermington is an 8 foot wagon surrounded by flowers.

She estimated that she and her husband work about eight hours a week during peak times and between two and three hours weekly during the summer and early fall. Her son Matthew, 2, is learning young and helps pick weeds.

contest.


"I use my gardening as therapy and during the high growing seasons I try to get in the yard about one hour every day," she said.


