
### A Falcon kind of Saturday

The board of directors of the local chamber wited to endorse the public safety miliage that city voters will settle Nov. 7. Directors are urging business owners and residents to vote year on the isaue that will provide one mill for enhanced police and fire departments.

departments are a factor to be considered by a business when moving into a community, ex-panding there or even staying, it's in the business community's best interest that this miliage proposal passes."

The one-mill proposal for 10 years will increase fire and police staffing equipment and build and operate a central fire station near 11 Mile and Orchard Lake roads. The coat to the owner of a \$100,000 home will be about \$4.17 per month which will be dedicationally and the state of the coat of

In addition to a new station, the fire department will add 16 full-time firefighiers, reduce response time, better organize use of volunteers, upgrade technology for better firefighting and medical programs.

The police department will use the millage for 18 new police staff, increase patrol cars per shift, improve "911" operations, improve crime analysis and prevention programs and reduce response time.
