

Hunters have to take back seat to fishermen for now

OUTDOOR DESIGNS
I know! I know! It's the best season. And the success reports are already starting to roll in. But there are a ton of bass anglers out there who are experiencing great success as well, not just on the local circuits, but on the pro circuits as well.

From Pelton's Point to Dollar Bay and all points in between Lake Orion was buzzing with bass anglers Sunday as 50 boats participated in the Oakland County Bass Masters' Lake Orion Open.

High, gusting winds and a slow-moving front didn't bode well for the anglers as just 23 of the 50 teams in the tournament returned

to the dock with fish. In all, 29 bass were caught for a total weight of 126.33 pounds.

Bill Man and Ken Trinka, of Waterford, won the tournament with a five-fish limit that weighed 10.39 pounds. The duo earned \$1,082.25 for their efforts.

"We used every bait in the boat and you had to work your baits real slow," said Trinka. "They just didn't want a fast-moving bait." Man and Trinka caught most of their fish in 10 to 12 feet of water.

Second-place honors and \$614.25 went to Ron and Mike Aiello of Goodrich for a catch of 10.11 pounds. They were followed in order of finish by Jeff Bianco and Dwight Perry of Utica with 8.85 pounds (\$409.50). Mike Dwyer of Clarkston and John Vanhook of Bloomfield Hills with 6.94 pounds (\$292.50), Tim Weber and Dan Wright of Lake Orion with 6.44 pounds (\$234.00), Ron Damiano of Lapeer and Blake Nordman of Huntington Woods with 6.05 pounds (\$175.50), and Arthur Austin of Southfield and Steve Randella of Garden City with 5.95 pounds (\$117.00). The Jan's Sport Shop Big Bass Award went to Bianco and Perry for a 4.50-pounder. They won \$75 cash and a \$50 gift certificate.

Oakland Bass Masters will hold an open tournament on Pontiac Lake on Sunday, Oct. 15.

Four divisions make up the regional. Of the 120 anglers fishing in the regional, the top 10 will advance to the Operation Bass Red Man All American and have a chance to compete for a grand prize worth \$100,000.

Livonia's Art Ferguson III was the highest angler, placing fourth in the standings with 39 pounds, 14 ounces and 163 points. Kenneth Purvey, of Wall Lake, placed seventh with 26 pounds, 8 ounces and 142 points. Kevin L. Long, of Bloomfield Hills, placed 14th with 28 pounds, 12 ounces and 75 points. Neil Coomes of Troy was 21st with 26 pounds, 5 ounces and 78 points. Livonia's Bruce Smith placed 26th in the division with 22 pounds, 1 ounce and 91 points

and Livonia's Ed Dietrich was 29th with 21 pounds, 12 ounces and 87 points. Livonia's Scott Emery and Livonia's Chuck Emery just missed qualifying for the regional, placing 32nd and 35th, respectively.

Three area anglers recently competed in the BASSMASTERS New York Invitational on the St. Lawrence River and Lake Ontario in Clayton, New York.

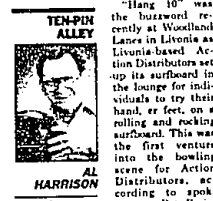

Kyle Greene, the amateur champion at last year's BASSMASTER Top 100 on Lake St. Clair was registered to fish, but a medical emergency kept the Bloomfield Hills angler grounded and he missed the tournament.

Michigan's own Kevin Van Dam, of Kalamazoo, won the tournament with a limit catch of 15 fish that tipped the scale at 41 pounds, 14 ounces.
