Every week of the year I speak with someone in person or by phone who just had by phone who just had a clothen dryer delivered to their home and they can't hook up the gas line. The copper tubing that hooks up to the back of the dryer won't fit unto the pipe with him out the high

They are very frustrated and not at all They are very instructed and not the hoppy with the store they purchased the dryer from. With the purchase of a \$3 ellow and a little advice they go home and solve the problem. Let me explain this a little further so that it doesn't happen to you.

Some stores will not hook up your new gas dryer when they deliver it for insurance reasons. There is a higher ininsurance reasons. There is a higher in-surance rate charged a business if they do hook up products and a lower rate for those who don't. When the delivery guys bring the product into the laundry room they will usually take the old dryer away with them. On the back of the old dryer is the sea allow onto dryer away with them. On the back which the old dryer is the gas elbow onto which the copper tubing fits. Make sure that they remove this elbow and give it to you or put it onto the new dryer. Now you can book up the gas line and please rmake sure the fitting is tight.

We don't worry about its operation until it fails to dry or makes a sound like a cement truck. We turn it on and leave the house or go to bed and never think twice about what could happen. We don't have a smoke detector located directly above the dryer and that hes already proven to the dryer and that hes already proven to be a life saver in several cases around us. I say cases because I have been hired many times to represent con-sumers who have had a house fire du-to a clothes dryer. The clothes dryer in the American home is the most likely product that could catch fire. In reality, it is a little furnace which we pay too little attention to.

Many times on my radio shows I have told consumers that if your gas dryer is running but it doesn't produce heat there is a cheap way out. Visit a repair

center and have them show you how to remove the gas valve assembly. This is not difficult to do an long as you get some how-to advice and many repair centers will check out and repair your centers will cheek out and repair your valve. This sounds simple enough doesn't it, except that once'n a while some guy who thinks he's a pretty smart cookie will decide to take it apart. Many times I have put back together a gas valve, that, had the consumer put it into the dryer would have blown the house off the face of the earth. That's called too much gas. called too much gas.

I was so impressed with the good that these very busy people were doing. So much had been done except for one little important thing. On the back of the clothes dryer there is a plastic vent line.
