PROPOSED COMPREHENSIVE HOUSING AFFORDABILITY STRATEGIES REPORT AND GRANT PERFORMANCE REPORT

In accordance with Title I of the National Affordable Housing Act signed by President Bush on November 26, 1990, the City of Farmington Hills, as a recipient of direct assistance through U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) programs, prepared a Comprehensive Housing Affordability Strategy (CHAS). This CHAS was a comprehensive planning document which identified needs for affordable and supportive housing and outlined a strategy to address those needs in Farmington Hills.

AVAILABILITY OF CHAS FOR REVIEW

The City of Farmington Hills has prepared a proposed FY 1994 Annual CHAS Performance Report for review by and comments from all interested residents. This document may be reviewed in the Community Development Office, located in the Farmington Hills City Hall, 31555 West Eleven Mile Road, during all regularly scheduled hours of operation from October 10, 1995 through November 10, 1995. At the conclusion of this review period, citizens comments shall be considered for any pertinent revisions of the CHAS.

ONE YEAR ANNUAL PERFORMANCE:

The FY 1994 Annual Performance Review describes the available resources, the investment of the available resources, the households and persons assisted, and finally, an assessment of the annual performance. The review includes topics such as housing rehabilitation, senior citizen housing, first-time home buyer activities, and rental subsidies.

The Grantee Performance Report provides information on how the City of Farmington Hills actually used its CDBG entitlement funds during the most recently completed program year.

PUBLIC HEARING

The City of Farmington Hills will conduct a public hearing for all interested residents at 5:30 p.m. on Wednesday, October 25, 1995, in the Lower Level Conference Room of the City of Farmington Hills City Hall, 31555 West Eleven Mile Road, Farmington Hills, Michigan. The purpose of the hearing will be to obtain the views of interested citizens, public agencies, and other interested parties on the housing needs and housing strategies for Farmington Hills which are reflected in the FY 1994 CHAS Performance Report and the Grantee Performance Report.

Proposals shall be made in the form of a bid price and a site development plan for the purchase and development of City of Farmington Hills owned property located adjacent to 13 Mile Road west of the intersection of 13 Mile and Northwestern Highway as depicted on Appendix "A", consisting of 5.81 acres, (does not include dedicated right-of-way), bounded by the following: 13 Mile Davis Lane Property (Appendix A-1 gives a legal description of the entire site.) Site proposals shall consist of a purchase price for the purchase of all of the Davis Lane Property and a narrative proposal description along with a conceptual site development plan for site development in accordance with all requirements and restrictions as are provided for in the instructions to bidders.

All proposals must be submitted following instructions furnished by the City of Farmington Hills. The proposal will be considered incomplete unless Appendix "B" is completed entirely. These proposals, when returned to the City, shall be accompanied by a certified check in the amount of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000), payable to the City of Farmington Hills as a guarantee for acceptance of a contract. Once the contract is finalized and approved by City Council, the \$10,000 certified check becomes a non-refundable down payment toward the purchase price. All other deposits included with proposals which aren't accepted shall be returned following the City Council's action.

It is the City's intention to sell this Davis Lane Property to the highest successful bidder who best meets the goals and objectives set forth in the instructions to bidders.

The City reserves the right to reject any or all proposals, to waive irregularities and/or information, and to establish such criteria as it deems to be in the best interest of the City of Farmington Hills, based upon not only the purchase price, but also the type and density outlined in the proposal and conceptual site plan.
