# **Another tough loss for Farmington**

In Lauri Niskanen's football coaching carer, he never witnessed as unusual an occurrence as he did early in the fourth quarter Friday.

Glenn looked impressive on both sides of the ball and like a team that that left behind a 21-20 loss to Walled Lake Central a week carlier.

The Rockets were led by 5-foot-5 senior tailback Jay Jackson, who carried 28 times for 172 yards and scored both touchdowns.

Sophomore Justin Barent quarterbacked a flawless Glenn offense, which compiled 304 yards without committing a turnover. He completed eight of 15 passes for 77 yards.

The Glenn defense did its job, holding the Falcons to 153 yards (48 in the second hall). Farmington's Jahs Slakesky, who entered the game averaging 172 rushing yards, was held to 69 on 21 attempts.

After a scoreless first quarter, Glenn had a six-play, 49-yard scoring drive that Jackson capped with a 16-yard run up the middle. Junior Steve Paling kirked the extra point.

Farmington countered with an

impressive, 14-play drive that ato up 6:52. Sliskosky put the Falcome on the board with a 3-yard TD run (his 14th of the year), and senior Jon Hood added the extra point.

The score remained 7-7 as Palling missed a 29-yord field goal attempt just prior to halftim for the halftim and a 10-7 lead on a 21-yeard Falling field goal. The turning point was the bad samp on the punt that set up Glenn's final score — an 11-yeard being field goal.

The Falcons weren't finished as Nick Latra returned the ensuing kickoff to the Glenn 45.

Farmington drove to the Glenn 13, but senior safety lan Wade ended hopes of a Farmington comeback when he intercepted Tim Stroit's pass at the 3.

Though dejected, Niskanen was pleased with his team's effort.

"Our kids played their hearts out, and this is the second year in a row we've played them tough," Niskanen said. "Our goal now is to win our final three games and finish 5-6."
