dodged recession like the ones that occurred in 1981-82 or 1990-91," Wilson said.

Comerica's recession watch index is a weighted average of three leading indicators: spread in the yield curve, adjusted bank reserve growth, and the Commerce De-

partment's Index of Leading Indicators. The index forecasts the probability of recession or an economic slowdown over the next 12 months.

Bloomfield lawyer lauded

Daniel P. Malone of Bloomfield Village became the first Michigan attorney to receive the Elaine R. "Boots" Fisher Award from the Federal Bar Association. He is a shareholder in the law firm Butzel Long, which has five Michigan branches, including one in Birmingham.

FBA presents the national award to encourage and recognize outstanding community, public and charitable work performed by its membership.

"I'm truly honored to be recognized by my peers," said Malone, who concentrates in product liability and civil litigation. "This award serves to reinforce my belief that every lawyer has a duty

and commitment to give of himself or herself back to the community."

In addition to earning a plaque to be displayed in FBA's national headquarters, a cash contribution of \$500 will be made in Malone's name to the Generation of Promise Program, a multi-cultural, urban-suburban school district he helped form.

Malone's also chairman of the board of University of Detroit Jesuit High School.

FBA's Cleveland chapter established the award as a memorial to the contributions made by Elaine "Boots" Fisher to improve the quality of life for all persons.

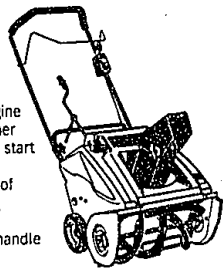
