

# Falcons place 3rd at county meet

Farmington has had one of the best girls cross-country teams in the area all season. It proved it in the Oakland County championships.

The Falcons of coach Liz Zynda placed third out of 38 teams Oct. 7 with 121 points. Troy Athens finished first at 51 while Novi was second with 106.

"I was real pleased with their performance," Zynda said. "It was pretty much how we're ranked and how it finished. I was pleased with the girls in that they moved up."

"Ann (Grimaldi) and Kate (Adams) were 45th and 46th after the first mile. And Natalie (Dawson) and Teresa (Derwinski) each passed 23 or 24 runners. Their last mile was their fastest."

Grimaldi ended up 14th with a time of 20:30.8 while Adams finished next in 20:31.3. Dawson was 26th at 20:44 while Derwinski finished 32nd in 20:51.

Amy Cameron came in 34th with a time of 20:58 while Ellen Adams clocked a 22:15, good for 78th. Megan Sanford ran her best race, a 22:13, to finish 110th.
