Hills firm seeks help to find stolen device

A Farmington Hills environ-mental consulting firm is asking for help in trying to locate a stolen van containing a radioactive raure device.

van containing a ratioactive gauge device. Early Monday morning, the white company van bearing the logo for NTH Consultants Ltd. was tolen from a westside De-troit neighborhood. The 1888 Chovrolet van contained the

gauge, which resembles a yellow shoebox with a foot-long handle above the base. Labels on the gauge identify it as containing ra-dioactive material.

The device was locked in a bright yellow case about 3 feet long. I foot wide and 2 feet tall. Radioactive II labels are on the sides of the case.

"You wouldn't get burned if you touched it, but prolonged ex-posure does pose a health risk," said Jim Parsons, a company

sald Jim Parsons, a company spokesman.
"We've made reports with the Detroit police, state police, health department, and the Nuclear Reg-ulatory Commission."
Parsons said people should def-initely stay away from the device.

"If someone stole it, let them keep the van, but give us back the gauge," said Parsons. "Just leave it in a parking lot somewhere."

The gauge is used to measure the moisture and density of con-struction material, usually soil.
