son said. One coach brought a team of 12 kids from Plymouth, which did not include a single resident, and added four resident players who are played sparingly, he said.

Myra Zolynsky also complained that players from Farmington Hills of equal ability to non-residents were not selected to teams because the coach already had coached the non-residents. She said a residency rule should force coaches to coach the talent they are given.

"If you're coaching a ninth-grade team, you get whatever players come out from the ninth grade," she said. "That's called coaching."

Costick said he will meet with the hockey association and the parents in an attempt to resolve the problems.

Advisory committee member Susan McKendrick also requested that the council consider the appointment of additional members to represent figure skaters on her committee.

Nancy Rice, who also serves on the committee to represent figure skating interests, said she was working hard for figure skating interests even though she is not rep-

representing the Farmington Hills Figure Skating Club Boosters. She objected to having more members on the committee.

"I have 30-plus years as an amateur and pro figure skater," she said. "Because people do not support her (McKendrick's) agenda, she wants more people."

Mark Accettura, an adult hockey skater, also suggested adding an additional representative to support that interest.

City council members voted 7-0 to add three alternates: one for the figure skating interests, one for youth hockey and one for adult hockey.

"I agree with Mr. (Aldo) Vagnozzi's proposal as the most logical way to solve this problem," said Councilman Jon Urant.

But Accettura may have arrived at a more basic truth. "You should not talk about hockey, God and politics," he said.
