## $Tranchida\ ordered$ to trial in death

Kenneth Tranchida's statemant to police that he "suddenly
decided" to kill Oakhad University student Tina Biggar helped
convince 46th District Court
Judge Bryan Levy that the 42year-old Southfield man should
stand trial for first-degree murder.

Levy ruled Friday that proacetions had sufficiently proved a
murder had been committed, that
there was probable cause to believe Tranchida did it and that he
did it intendionally — with some
reremeditation — after Tranchidia's two-day preliminary exam.

"Whatever his uttimate motive,
it appears from that statement
that his decision was arrived at
after some although fast, weighing factors," Levy said about
restimony from Michigan State
Police
detective Leonard
Goretaki, who took a confeas.on
from Tranchida
Goretaki teatified Friday that
Tranchida studd him he "suddenly
decided" to kill Biggar 23, of
Farmington Hills, on the morning
of Aug. 23 when she told him how
upset she was about her credicard bills, her condemned apartment and her recent breakup with
a boyfered.

"He said he had never seen her to sad. He felt a girl like Tina shouldn't have to live with those types of problems," Goretaki said about Tranchida's Sept. 26 confession to police. "He said he wanted to let her know there was semeone there who cared. So but his hands on her chest and pushed her back and she hit her head on asafe."

Tranchida told Goretaki that he blacked out at that point and docan't know what happened.

"He said he blacked out, like he was in a fog. He said, 'I could have choked her, punched her three times or beat her. But whatever I did to her was from the neck up, "Goretaki asid.

Biggar's body was Gound behind the former home of Tranchida's aunt, on Nine Mile near Evergreen.

Tranchida wan't the only per-son who said he was uncertain about exactly what caused Big-gar's death.
Oakland County Medical Es-aminer Kanubhai Virani testified Thuraday that hecause there was no soft tissue left on the decom-posed skeletal remains and no de-tectable fractures or evidence of trauma like a knife or gunshot wound, he could only generalize the cause of death as head and neck traums.

"You just come to the best conclusion based on the available information," Virani said.

He said the fact that she was missing several days, was found outside away from her residence and may have bled in the trunk of her car led him to classify Biggra's death as a homicide.

Tranchida's attorney, Michael Modelski, arqued Friday that his client should not be tried on first-degree murfer charges when the cause of death is not even clear.

"For first-degree, the prosecution must establish premeditation and deliberations. They have failed to do that. There is also no other evidence of how it is she


