Brooks Patterson and representatives of sirtually every ethnic and minority group the college attempts to serve. She has been supported publicly by faculty, students, and administrative staff at the college, and is nationally recognized as one of the country's outstanding community college leaders.

But Carol Crew, Pamela Davis and Douglas Wakefield, under the leader-ship of Sandra Ritter and Judith Wiser, wan to spend \$250,000 and more of our money because — well, they just don't like Calkins' style. Sim-ple arithmetic tells me our elected quintet each owe the Oakland County
