Murphy's 'Vampire' is toothless



TICKETS PLEASE
On a dark and foggy night, a freighter rolls over fishing boats comes into the docks at a New York City shipyard. The wolf that leaps from the vessel can be seen in shadow changing into the figure of a man. Nosferatu has landed.

What's a nice opening like this? You'll want to ask after sitting through the rest of "Vampire in Brooklyn," a toothless Eddie Murphy horror comedy that makes "Blacula" look like "Schindler's List."

This is supposed to be Eddie Murphy's comeback, but only one sequence recalls his talent for mimicking, done so well in movies like "Trading Places" or "Coming to America." His impersonation of a Bible-thumping preacher has some funny moments, but it's directed clumily and goes on far too long.

Murphy in fact spends much of his time as straight man to Kadeem Hardison as the slave ghost Julius. As the movie drags on, he starts to decompose, losing an ear here, an arm there, replacing what he can with parts from department store mannequins.

As a horror comedy, "Vampire in Brooklyn" is equally inept in both categories. The jokes come across gross instead of funny and the delivery, especially Murphy's, is uninspired. Even his mummy-like coffin looks tacky and garish.

Bassett, no robust in the cur-

rent "Strange Days," looks surprisingly sickly in her part. Nothing looks good, thanks to cinematography that's overly murky and dark, even by vampire movie standards.

Cheapness is a trademark of director Wes Craven, creator of the popular "Nightmare on Elm Street" movies, though usually he delivers a clever twist or two. You'd think a veteran like Craven would give us something new, especially in the wake of "Interview with the Vampire."
