


To a tea

Sung Dynasty (960-1270) when purple clay was first discovered in the Yixing region of China. It flourished in the Ming and Qing dynasties (1573-1911) when master potters gave each teapet its distinctive finish. Today's Yixing teapets are even better than those of earlier eras, because the artisans produce replicas of old pots as well as innovative, new designs so that each teapet maintains its own character and "flavor." Yixing ware has the unusual ability to absorb the flavors of the tea so that the teapet becomes more seasoned with use. (The fired clay contains small air pockets that provide insulation.) The Print Gallery in Southfield has a beautiful selection of Yixing ware teapets from \$28 to \$34.
